PROBABLE CAUSE ORDER

On this date, the Probable Cause Review Board, having investigated and considered the allegations set forth in CIC 2013-03, unanimously finds that there is probable cause to believe that Respondent Bernard Fazzini violated the provisions of the Ethics Act as follows:

Count One:

In December, 2011, Respondent used his public office as a member of the Harrison County Commission to provide an interest-free loan to the Spelter Fire Department for its private benefit and to gain votes in the 2012 Harrison County Commission elections.

In accordance with West Virginia Code §6B-2-4(f), the Commission staff is hereby ORDERED to prepare a Statement of Charges and to schedule this matter for a public hearing to determine the truth or falsity of the charges.
